### **TCCN to Terminate in Miami's NAP of the Americas**

Trans-Caribbean Cable Company (TCCC) is pleased to announce that the Trans-Caribbean Cable Network (TCCN) has selected Terremark Worldwide, Inc.'s (AMEX:TWW) NAP of the Americas as its primary termination point for the portion of the TCCN project in the United States. After a thorough selection process, TCCC entered into an agreement with Terremark which makes all of Terremark's premium NAP services available to each of the TCCN owners.

"As a carrier-neutral collocation space and one of the most connected facilities in the world, Terremark's NAP of the Americas is the ideal location for us", said Mr. Brian Crawford, President of TCCC. "The NAP of the Americas is clearly the most desirable and secured connection point in Miami as it already serves as the telecom gateway to Latin America."

With a design transmission capability of nearly two terabits per second, the Central Caribbean North project will land in the South Florida area and then extend through diverse fiber routes directly into the Miami NAP of the Americas, providing an ideal long-term solution to the TCCN owners.

The first phase of TCCN, named the Central Caribbean North Sub-Project, involves the construction of new undersea fiber optic cable segments between Miami, Haiti, Jamaica, and Dominican Republic. Additional connectivity to other locations in the Caribbean region are also under consideration by the consortium for future development.

Continued Mr. Crawford, "Extension to the NAP, when coupled with this agreement, guarantees that TCCN will avoid recurring backhaul charges, resulting in millions of dollars of savings to the owners over the life of the system."

TCCC serves as the carrier-neutral coordinator of the TCCN project, which is based upon an open investment model called the "Virtual Consortium™ Model" (VCM). Unlike private or 'club' cables of the past, the model encourages equity ownership by all interested parties with unbiased operations and management provided on a carrier-neutral basis.
